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- Functions and responsibilities of the Union and the States, issues and challenges pertaining to the federal structure, devolution of powers and finances up to local levels and challenges therein
- Fundamental Rights, Fundamental Duties and Directive Principles of State Policy
- Separation of powers between various organs dispute redressal mechanisms and institutions
- Parliament and State Legislatures structure, functioning, conduct of business, powers & privileges and issues arising out of these
- Appointment to various Constitutional posts, powers, functions and responsibilities of various Constitutional Bodies
- Decentralization in India- Panchayati Raj institutions- Urban Local Government and Rural Local Government
- Indian Economy and issues relating to planning, mobilization of resources, growth, development and employment
- Basic conceptions and terminologies of Economics and Development
- Economic Planning in India- Planning Commission, Five-year plans, NITI Aayog etc.

On an average 25 learners of NSOU, from various disciplines including Science, Commerce, Education, Humanities and Social Sciences, participated in the offline SLP/ECS with 52% participation of female learners.

The SLP/ECS has been prematurely concluded keeping in mind the upcoming PG Term-end Examinations and Assignments of the NSOU learners, and the final session took place on 11.11.2022 to conclude the 1st cycle of the Extended Counselling Sessions on *Social Sciences*.
