We rampantly use the knowledge and the canons of the social science research, directly or indirectly, as we engage in intimate relationships or participate in public spheres and public policies as we march on to make daily decisions in industry, professional and social life, health care etc. Social research is not just for hard core academics in the precincts of college classrooms and campuses; high school mentors, parents, business advertisers, managers, administrators, officials, service providers, health care professionals, and others use its findings and principles. They use them to raise children, reduce crime, manage health concerns, sell products or services, digest news events, and so forth. There is undoubtedly no inhibitions in claiming the importance and centrality of social science research. Despite scattered criticism to the contrary, research is highly significant for comprehending social life generally and to take the decisions we make each day.



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This probably is the reason why social research demands a special attention in university curriculum and development of self-learning materials especially in conglomeration with the special demands of the New Educational Policy, 2020. This workshop intends to deliberate on the research methodology especially the development of self-learning methods and translation techniques for our learners within the ambit of NEP 2020 guidelines.

- 6. Surveys- Questionnaires and Interviews/ construction and use of questionnaire and Interview schedules and conduct of interview / use of probing techniques
- 7. Quantitative data analysis- Descriptive social statistics

## Qualitative research methods in Social Science

- 1. Doing qualitative research: Introduction to qualitative research; theories underlying qualitative research
- 2. Ethics and politics of qualitative research
- 3. Methods of qualitative research: Ethnography, Case Study and Feminist Research
- 4. Data collection methods: Interviews, Observation, and Documents.
- 5. Reflexivity, validity and reliability in qualitative research
- 6. Qualitative data analysis: Transcription and data management; Thematic analysis.
- 7. Other research methods: Mixed methods.
- 8. Writing academic research reports.



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The applicants are required to send an abstract of 300 words on any one of the above topics to csrabanti91@gmail.com

The authors of the selected abstracts will be asked to develop full length paper of 4000 to 5000 words within the given dead-line. The selected papers will be asked for presentation.

### **Publication of the Workshop Report**

A Workshop Report shall be compiling the selected papers and the guidelines for Development of Self-learning materials and Translation in concomitance with the NEP Regulations, 2020. This shall be published in the due course with an ISBN. The copy right of the publication will remain with the NSOU.

The selected participants shall be invited to our Salt Lake Head quarter on 31.07.2024 to present their papers. They shall be given an ecertificate after presentation. They will also be given a copy of the edited volume post publication. In case of well-developed chapters, the authors may be invited to write self-learning materials as well by the School within the university guidelines.
